



# Magdalene College



### An Historic Setting in the heart of Cambridge

Magdalene College is ideally situated close to the historic centre of Cambridge on the banks of the River Cam. The city is arguably one of the most beautiful in Britain and provides the perfect blend of ancient and modern, with attractive shops and restaurants set against the unique backdrop of the Colleges and University. The city centre, whose famous landmarks include King's College Chapel, the Market Square and the Bridge of Sighs, is relatively compact and easily accessible on foot.

Magdalene College has the longest river frontage of any in Cambridge.

The College of St Mary Magdalene dates back to 1428 when King Henry VI approved the establishment of a hostel for Benedictine monks on this riverside site. The monks came from their monasteries in the Fenlands to study Theology and Canon Law in Cambridge.

Over the centuries the College has evolved and grown, and now enjoys the eclectic mix of architectural styles that our visitors find so appealing. The most famous structure is the Pepys Building which houses the diaries and personal book collection that Samuel Pepys bequeathed in 1703. Located in Second Court, it is considered the principal ornament of the College and is of considerable architectural interest. The most modern addition is Cripps Court which opened in the autumn of 2005.

#### ALUMNI

The College has an impressive list of famous alumni including Samuel Pepys, Charles Stuart Parnell. Charles Kingsley, 4 Archbishops (Cranmer, Grindle, Ussher and Ramsay) the Marquis of Queensbury, Prince Dulip Singh, George Mallory, Sir Michael Redgrave and John Simpson.

#### MAGDALENE TODAY

Today, the College has some 320 undergraduates, about 180 graduate students and around 60 fellows and other teaching officers. There is also an administrative and domestic staff of about 140, so that the total College community numbers close to 700. Recent building and acquisitions allow Magdalene to accommodate its entire undergraduate population and many of the graduate students within two or three minutes' walk of the College. Cripps Court houses 42 students in a modern and inspiring courtyard setting on Chesterton Road opposite the Fellows' Garden.

#### TRAVEL:

#### By road.

Magdalene College is close to the M11 motorway linking to the A14 and the M1

#### By rail.

The College is less than 2 miles from Cambridge Railway Station where the frequent service means that clients can be in London in just 45 minutes

#### By air.

Stansted airport is approximately 30 miles by car and there is also an excellent rail link to Cambridge. Heathrow airport is 71 miles away and Gatwick 95
